Reporting problems

West Berkshire Council deal with the resolution of all sorts of problems from potholes, dog fouling, streetlights, graffiti, etc. You can report any issues that you have online via the WBC website. Just follow this link: Problem Reporting.

Planning Applications

West Berkshire Council invites Purley on Thames Parish Council to comment on planning applications within the parish. The Parish Council's input is not binding upon West Berkshire Council, but comments may be considered in reaching a decision.

You can also see the details of any planning application via the <u>Planning Portal</u> on the WBC website. If you scroll down to the bottom of the Planning Portal webpage you will find a map showing recent planning applications in WBC. You can zoom in on the map to just see Purley on Thames. Also, an orange notice should be displayed at the boundary of any property/location subject to a planning application.

Any individual can comment on a planning application, both for and against, direct to WBC by <u>email</u>.

The Parish Planning Committee meets about every two weeks. The meeting is open to the public and there is opportunity for you to comment on any particular application. To see the agenda for the next meeting, which details the planning applications to be considered, see Planning Committee meeting.

West Berkshire Council has introduced a free online service to allow residents to check to see if planning permission is required for any possible building alterations. This service will make it easier for residents to understand if they need to submit a planning application for items such as solar panels, loft conversions, adding an outbuilding or adding a dropped kerb. You can access this new service on the West Berkshire Council "Do I need Planning Permision?" webpage.

West Berkshire Council also offer planning pre-application advice service for which a fee is chargeable. More information about this can be found on the West Berkshire Council's pre-application advice service webpage.

Monday 9.30 am - 2.00 pm


Thursday 2.00 pm - 5.00 pm

Project Purley Local History Society



A visit by the Queen of Spain to Oliver Dixon's stables in Reading

Friday 17th October at 7.30pm
The large Barn at Goosecroft
A talk by Caroline Piller "Horse Dealing in Reading"

Guests and visitors - £5 Members - Free

Horse dealing was an extremely important trade in town and country. Caroline will describe how the well-known horse dealers of Reading in the 19th and early 20th centuries carried out their business, which could be quite lucrative.

The last dealers in Reading were Oliver Dixon Ltd, of Crescent Road Repository at Mockbeggar Farm in Earley. They were rewarded with royal patronage and worldwide fame but were forced to give up their premises in 1941. Oliver Dixon was well known in Reading, mixing socially with Sol Joel, the Palmers, Arthur Hill, and Vincent and Dick Francis of Emmbrook.

Join Terry Dixon for this walk around an area that is not well known. Bordered by the railway to the north, North St., Chatham St., to the east & Oxford Road to Reading West Bridge. It covers growth from 12th Century Abbey Lands, through Victorian times to an important residential area & much more!



Thursday 23rd October – 2pm - Online Talk "White Waltham Airfield and the ATA" by Dr Richard Marks - £5 – pre-booking required

The Second World War was the first conflict in which aircraft played a major role.

The Royal Air Force expanded hugely in the late 1930s in anticipation of a probable global conflict and needed massive numbers of new state of the air aircraft. Losses would also need to be replaced quickly, with aircraft to be delivered

directly to squadrons ready for service. But how was this to be done? The system used in the First World War of sending a pilot to collect a new aeroplane from an aircraft park just would not work. So, something

else was needed. The Air Transport Auxiliary (ATA) was created in 1940 to support the RAF by ferrying new, damaged and repaired aircraft to where they needed to be. The men and women of the ATA were expected, and did, fly anything that the RAF was using with little training other than a copy of the pilot's notes. This is their story, and the story of the ATA headquarters at White Waltham Airfield.
